<u>Activity</u>: Create your own alternative fairy tale

Materials:

- Story template for beginning, middle and end (attached at end of lesson plan)
- Coloring materials
- Something to write your story with (pencil or pen)


Directions:

- Print out the pages attached for the beginning, middle and end of the story.
- Think about your favorite fairy tale and a way that you can tell the story in a different way.
 - Will the main character be different? Will you tell the story from a different point of view?
- Write your story, beginning, middle and end on the lines of your pages; it's ok if it is longer or shorter.
- Draw the pictures that illustrate your story in the provided space. Maybe you will add decorative borders or details around your whole page.

Tips:

- Get creative with your story and think about the kind of fairy tale you would want to hear!
- If it's helpful to you, you can start with your pictures and then write your text.
- Have fun and make sure to share your story with friends!
