Activity: Portrait Painting

Materials:

- Paper (or canvas)
- Paints (any kind you have or like, I used watercolor)
- Brushes
- pencil

Directions:

- Start with a picture of your chosen person or pet or grab a mirror to create a selfportrait. You can also ask someone you know to pose for you.
- Use your pencil to create a light sketch of your subject.
- Begin with light colors and build with shadows and highlights. Use the picture to identify shapes and help you to create forms.


Tips:
