

The Currier Museum of Art is restoring the George Byron Chandler House, an

architectural treasure from the late 19th century that sits across the street from the museum. The main floor of the house preserves impressive stained glass windows, original wallpaper, and fine wood carving. These areas will be open to the public as an expansion of the museum, specifically to represent New Hampshire in the 19th century. We need your help to renovate this beautiful home to its original glory. The Currier Museum of Art aims to raise over \$2 million dollars in order to support the work ahead, and also develop an endowment for future upkeep and maintenance, public access, outreach, and education programs. PHASE I WORK

(Summer 2021 through Fall 2021) This work must be undertaken immediately in order to ensure the house is heated for the winter to prevent further deterioration of interior finishes.

Repair slate roofing

Repair/replace copper roof cresting

Repair/replace skylights

Replace roofing on ell

Masonry restoration

Chimneys, walls, and cleaning of brownstone

Hazardous materials removal

Mechanical HVAC systems

Building insulation

Plumbing systems

Electrical/alarm

PHASE II WORK

(Winter 2022 through Fall 2022) Phase II work is essential for full occupancy and use of the property.

Remove aluminum siding & repair/replace clapboards and trim

Repair wooden windows/Paint existing vinyl windows

Install new storm windows

Repair/replace basement window sash

Restore missing windows on the first floor

Interior plaster repairs

Preserve historic floor plan & interior features

Repair bulkhead for exterior basement egress

Repair main porch, including granite steps

Add ceramic studio

Add accessibility and elevator

PHASE III WORK

(Fall 2022 through Fall 2023)

Phase III work items can be undertaken at a later time as funds become available. Cost estimates are very preliminary and will be further refined once the scopes of work are fully developed.

Light fixtures for 1st floor primary spaces
